# how-to: headboard

A pro made this one, but here's how you can get the look.



You'll need: Plywood (38" x 55" for a twin bed), spray-on fabric glue, cotton batting (38" x 55"), fabric (44" x 60"), a heavy-duty staple gun, picture wire, and hooks.

- Spray one side of the wood with glue. Align edges of batting with edges of wood. Press batting into the glue. Let dry completely.
- Spread fabric printed-side-down on the floor. Center wood, batting-down, on fabric.
- Wrap fabric over wood. Pull it taut. Secure with a staple, about an inch in from the edge of the wood. Repeat every few inches around the board's edges. Use picture wire and hooks to hang it behind your bed.
